The season of Lent is upon us, a season where we are called to search our hearts and be found by God in the wilderness of our thoughts. We walk through a time in which we "test" or question ourselves. Where are we in this journey that we walk with Christ? Where has God strengthened us and how can we be intentional about our faith? With the Spirits guidance we can be formed into a deeper faith and die to ourselves while being raised anew with Jesus this coming Easter morning. This same journey is shared by our church. We ask how we can serve God more faithfully. How can we be a welcoming people in Christ's name?

Bishop Eaton has asked that pastors review the church's document called, "The Use of the Means of Grace" some time ago and pastors have been in conversation about how we are welcoming and in particular, who is welcomed at the Lord's Table.

Traditionally, those who have joined the body of Christ in baptism have been invited to the table. Yet, one may ask, where in the scripture is this supported, as Luther surely would ask. The Lord instituted the meal on the night before his crucifixion. He instructed his Disciples, a word that means students, to do this every time that they gather. As Christ's church was formed in discernment, the body of Christ limited this meal to those believers only. That tradition has been upheld for years.

The question that is being asked of us now is, is this faithful to our understanding of what Christ did and what direction the church is being lead regarding this.

While this may be another reason for some to become concerned, it would be most helpful if we approach this in the spirit of Jesus Christ. What is it like to come into a church where this meal is central and be "left behind?" There are also people who come to a service with no knowledge of what Holy Baptism is. You could imagine their confusion as they read a bulletin stating the baptized are welcome at the table.

Finally, we know that we meet Christ in the meal and believe in the real presence of our Lord who meets us there. Thus, we can easily conclude that the meal is salvific, or that we find salvation where Christ meets us in this meal in a similar way of the other sacrament, baptism. So, I wanted to inform you of this conversation that is occurring. Where the conversation will lead, I simply do not know, but I do think it is important as we consider being the presence of Christ to others in this world. Perhaps you would contemplate upon this and include this in your prayers in the coming months that God will continue to lead Christ's church a direction that is faithful.

Blessings as we walk towards the cross, and a glorious Easter morning!


